




If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing. Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end. For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

#### Boiler Challenge Grant program

As you may be aware, we desperately need to replace our boiler system next year. The cost of the new boiler system is expected to be about \$65,000. The Diocese Advance and Development fund (A&D fund) committee has provided us a loan for the boiler, as well as a challenge grant for any funds that we can raise directly for the boiler replacement. The challenge grant is effective for boiler fund specific donations from Dec 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021 through Dec 15<sup>th</sup> of 2022, so that people can consider this in their annual giving and tax plans.

The A&D fund will match our donations in 3 tiers:

- first \$10k donated is matched \$1 for \$1 given eg \$10k additional
- second \$10k is matched \$0.75 for \$1 given eg \$7.5k additional
- third \$10k is matched \$0.50 for \$1 given eg \$5k additional

So if we were to raise \$30k from parish donors, the Diocese A&D fund would provide us an additional \$22.5k. This would nearly fully fund the boiler! For donations to the boiler fund, please add a specific note in the check memo line stating that it is for the boiler fund-challenge grant. #### Rectory Restoration Update

Your Buildings and Grounds team could not be more thankful for all the support and generosity of the parish. We could not have done it without 25 plus volunteers and multiple financial donations. After just 10 weeks, we applied over 32 gallons of paint; we added new kitchen cabinets and counters; light fixtures and electrical outlets/switches; new carpet; bathroom amenities; new garage door; storm door and door hardware. Volunteers refinished and rebuilt existing cabinets, closets and flooring. It's probably the biggest project our team, with your help, has every taken on. We had estimated the cost of the project at about \$20,000, but had to add kitchen cabinets when the old ones were too poor to salvage. The cost came in about \$23,980, but your donations took this down to about \$10,000.
